***AGE LEVEL MINISTRIES***

***NURSERY MINISTRIES***

- A1 **Nursery Volunteer-11:00 Worship Service:** Volunteers assist the Nursery staff with supervision of children (ages birth to 4 years). Volunteer activities include reading books, playing games, singing songs, etc.
- A2 **Nursery Volunteer-Weekday evenings (6-9 pm):** Occasionally, the Nursery will need volunteers to help out during the week when a worker is unavailable. Volunteers assist the Nursery staff with supervision of children (ages birth to 8 years). Volunteer activities include reading books, playing games, singing songs, etc.
- A3 **Nursery Staff Appreciation Team:** Provide encouraging notes, baked goods and other tokens of appreciation for our Nursery staff throughout the year.

***CHILDREN'S MINISTRIES***

- B1 **Sunday School Teacher for Aug. 2009- July 2010:** If you are currently assigned to a class, please show that this is your volunteer position.
- B2 **Sunday School Assistant:** Help Sunday School teacher assist children in completing Sunday School lessons and tasks.
- B3 **Substitute Sunday School Teacher:** Teach children's Sunday School in the event that the regular Sunday School teacher is unavailable.
- B4 **Sunday School Teacher Recruitment:** Assist in recruiting Sunday School teachers and assigning classes for fall 2010.
- B5 **Puppet Ministry:** Act out skits using puppets. Puppet shows are for various children's ministries, Children's Church, Sunday School Classes and the Weekday Ministry Program.
- B6 **Sunday School Teacher Appreciation:** Provide encouraging notes, plan appreciation activities/services in church, etc., for our Sunday School teachers.
- B7 **Children's Church Leader:** Work as team to coordinate and present a worship service for the children of the church during the 11:00 AM worship service.
- B8 **Children's Church Team Member:** Work with team to escort children to the chapel; sing and assist team leader during the worship service.
- B9 **Friend in Faith for Confirmand:** Pray for, encourage and help confirmands to better understand the commitment they are making as they are confirmed. Plan to participate in field trips and meet with your confirmand on a regular basis.
- B10 **Weekday Ministries Fundraising Volunteer:** Help with sorting and distributing fundraising items upon their arrival.

- B11 **Weekday Ministries Office Assistant:** Help Weekday Ministries Director with miscellaneous office duties, answering phones, etc.
- B12 **Children's Sermon Traditional Worship (8:30) Feb 2010 - Feb 2011:** Prepare and present a 3 minute children's message on Sunday morning.
- B13 **Children's Sermon Blended Worship (11:00) Feb 2010 - Feb 2011:** Prepare and present a 3 minute children's message on Sunday morning.
- B14 **Children's programs for Summer 2010:** Help with service camp, craft camp, book club, Thursday day camp, or possible Wednesday preschool hours for summer months 2010.
- B15 **Summer Pre-School Camp:** 2 sessions of Tuesday-Thursday 9:30-1:00 camp for preschoolers ages 3-5 before June 1st, 2010. Volunteers needed include classroom leaders, helpers, crafts, snacks and photos. Volunteers will receive a discounted price for their children to attend summer ministry events.
- B16 **Creative Arts Camp:** This will be a 3 day camp, Tuesday-Thursday, 9:30-1:30. Volunteers will need to sign up to "host a rotation", this can be cooking, woodworking, music, chimes, bells, theater arts, puppets, dance, sign language, foreign language, science experiments, crafts, room decor, scrapbooking, nail art, games, or whatever skill you have that you would want to share with children.
- B17 **Help with Children's Ministries:** Work with other volunteers who have an interest in Children's Ministries to coordinate and implement activities which will foster the spiritual, emotional and social growth of the children in our church. Activities may include but are certainly not restricted to: Lenten Festivals, Advent Festivals, stewardship campaigns, possible parent night out, movie nights, princess evening event, pirates evening event, etc.
- B18 **South District Summer Camp Counselor (4<sup>th</sup>/5<sup>th</sup> Grade Camp):** Come spend a great week with 4<sup>th</sup>/5<sup>th</sup> graders at Lakeview ([www.lakeviewmcc.org](http://www.lakeviewmcc.org))! The week is jam-packed with fun and worship. You go into the week planning to teach your campers something and you come out with so much more than you could have ever imagined! It requires one week out of town, but the church will cover your registration fee.
- X4 **Children's Choir Assistant:** See *Music Ministries*
- X5 **Children's Hand chime/Rainbow Bell Assistant:** See *Music Ministries*

## ***VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL (VBS) MINISTRIES***

- C1 **Daytime Vacation Bible School Volunteer:** Be a recreation, music, science, snack or craft leader. Be a helper, teacher, photographer, sound/AV person in our 2010 Summer Vacation Bible School. Sign-up for specific areas will be in April, 2010.
- C2 **Evening Vacation Bible School Volunteer:** Be a recreation, music, science, snack or craft leader. Be a helper, photographer, meal provider, meal preparer, sound/AV person in our Evening VBS 2010. Sign-up for specific areas will be in April, 2010.
- C3 **VBS Decorations:** Be part of or lead the decorating team for VBS 2010. This would be done in weeks leading up to Vacation Bible School 2010.

## ***YOUTH MINISTRIES (grades 6-12)***

- D1 **Adult Leader for Velocity:** Do you like air hockey, video games, basketball, food, worship and lots of laughter? If any of those are things you like to do, you should consider coming to hang out with the 6<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> graders at Velocity! Being an Adult Leader means you are there to help with all of the activities that go on at Velocity and as a “back up” for Morgan. You have the opportunity to build relationships with the youth and get into their world a little bit. We meet on Sundays from 5:00pm-7:30 PM, Jr. High will meet from 5:00 – 6:45 PM, and Sr. High will meet from 5:45 – 7:30 PM. You can choose how many Sundays a month you want to volunteer. After you have a chance to get your feet wet a little bit, we will get you on one of the teams and you can start helping plan what happens.
- D2 **Transportation for Youth—Personal Vehicle:** Help transport the youth to various events that take place outside of the church in your personal vehicle.
- D3 **Transportation of Youth—Drive Church Bus:** Willing to be trained by one of the church’s approved trainers to drive the church bus in order to help transport the youth to activities outside of the church.
- D4 **Youth Sunday School Teacher:** Help out with the junior high or senior high Sunday School class by teaching on a quarterly basis, or shorter time periods if need be. Help the youth to dig into the Scriptures and learn what they mean.
- D5 **Substitute Youth Sunday School Teacher:** Help out as needed with the junior high or senior high Sunday School class.
- D6 **Jr. High Girls Bible Study:** Spend one hour on Tuesdays digging into the Scriptures with our Jr. High girls. Be ready for lots of giggling!
- D7 **Jr. High Boys Bible Study:** Spend one hour on Tuesdays digging into the Scriptures with the Jr. High boys. Be ready for some active learning...basketball court here we come!
- D8 **Sr. High Bible Study:** Come together with the Senior High for an hour on Tuesdays for some discussions on how Scripture applies to life and how to deal with issues that go on in their everyday lives.
- D9 **South District Summer Camp Counselor:** Come spend a great week at Lakeview ([www.lakeviewmcc.org](http://www.lakeviewmcc.org))! The week is jam-packed with fun and worship. You will have the choice of working with elementary age, junior high or high school throughout the week. You go into the week planning to teach your campers something and you come out with so much more than you could have ever imagined! It requires one week out of town, but the church will cover your registration fee.
- D10 **Attend UM ARMY:** Facilitate groups of students during the week of June 20 – 26, 2010 in serving Jesus by serving those in need through various acts of service. Adult volunteers transport students to/from the work site, give leadership to them, delegate responsibilities, and assist in the clean-up as you build relationships with them. UM ARMY requires participants to be "out-of-town" for the week.
- D11 **Attend Summit (Junior High Mission Trip):** Travel with a group of junior high students to serve Jesus by serving others. Adult volunteers transport students to/from the work site, give

leadership to them, delegate responsibilities, and assist in the clean-up as you build relationships with them. Requires time out-of-town.

- D12 **Media Expert:** Help to incorporate technology and other media into the youth or confirmation program. Use your talents to produce videos, slide shows, etc.
- D13 **“On-Call” Adult Leader:** Not sure you’re ready to sign up to be here on any sort of regular basis for Velocity? We can still use your help! Sign up to be an “on-call” adult, which means Morgan will call you when the regularly assigned adults are not able to be here for some reason.
- D14 **Adventure Week:** Attend a week-long trip in March or August that will involve more adventures than anyone can handle, we will admire all of Christ’s creations and experience a different part of our country. Location undecided.
- X6 **Assist with Youth Music:** See *Music Ministries*

## ***COLLEGE AND CAREER MINISTRIES***

- E1 **Help with Care Packages for College Students:** Assist in assembling care packages from the church and mail/deliver them to students prior to final exam time during the school year.

## ***ADULT EDUCATION AND SPIRITUAL GROWTH MINISTRIES***

- F1 **Sunday School Teacher for Adults:** Lead Sunday School lesson on a regular basis or help to form new Sunday School classes for adults.
- F2 **Substitute Sunday School Teacher for Adults:** Be available to teach Sunday School to adults on an "as-needed" basis.
- F3 **Lead a Short-Term Study:** Lead or facilitate short-term courses (1-13 weeks) such as Bible topics, books, parenting skills, listening skills, financial management, personal development, etc.
- F4 **Lead Disciple Bible Study:** Lead Disciple Bible Study for 33 - 35 weeks.
- F5 **Library Steward Team:** Help process and shelve materials in the church library. Work to meet library needs of the congregation.

## ***PURE GOLD MINISTRIES (Formerly Older Adult Ministries)***

- G1 **Visit Home Bound Members:** Provide a loving friendship to people who are unable to get out regularly by making monthly contacts through visits, phone calls and cards.
- G2 **Visit Nursing Homes and Assisted-Living Residents:** Provide a loving friendship to people who are now residing in care facilities by making monthly contacts through visits, phone calls and cards.
- G3 **Caroling @ Christmas to Home Bound and Nursing Home Residents:** Coordinate event by setting date, advertising for volunteers, making copies of song lyrics and arranging schedule of visits for the evening. (A list of home bound and nursing home residents will be provided for your use.)

- G4 **Serve on Pure Gold Council:** Work with Associate Pastor and Adult Ministries Coordinator to organize programs, activities and outings for Senior Adults.
- G5 **Soup with the Staff:** Help set up and prepare and/or serve a simple soup, salad, dessert meal once/quarter for our seniors who are ambulatory. Drive the church van to help provide transportation to and from the meal. Attend and visit with the seniors and staff members who attend the meal.

### ***FAMILY MINISTRIES***

- H1 **Help with Family Ministries:** Work with other volunteers who have an interest in Family Ministries to coordinate and implement activities which will foster the spiritual, emotional and social growth of the families in our church. Activities may include but are certainly not restricted to: Family Retreats, Parenting Seminars, Marriage Enrichment Seminars, etc.
- H2 **Participate in Family Camping Ministry:** Help to coordinate family camping retreats throughout the year.
- H3 **Pew Parents:** Volunteer to sit with children whose parents are participating in the bell choir or sanctuary choir who are too old for nursery care. Volunteers would sit with and monitor kids only during the bells/choir songs.

### ***WOMEN'S AND MEN'S MINISTRIES***

- J1 **Moms in Touch:** Meet weekly to pray for our students, teachers and schools so that our area schools are protected by prayer. The group is open to moms who home school, have their children in public and/or private schools, and also moms with college age students.
- J2 **Celebration:** A United Methodist women's ministry which includes a quarterly program with brunch, prayer, worship and guest speakers. Women volunteers are needed to help greet people, provide refreshments and decorations, be a hostess at the tables, set up and clean up, pray with women, play instruments, and help with leading worship.
- J3 **Women's Retreat Coordination Team:** Serve as part of the team that will cover all aspects of planning and implementing a retreat for women which focuses on spiritual renewal and bonding with other Christian women.
- J4 **Master's Men:** Master's Men is a quarterly ministry to provide men a forum for spiritual encouragement and to challenge and inspire men to be devoted disciples of Jesus Christ. Opportunities to participate include: preparing breakfast for the meetings, set up, clean up, tear down, phone calling, arranging program speakers and special music, sharing personal testimonies, teaching and participating in special men's studies.
- J5 **Men's Retreat Coordination Team:** Serve as part of the team that will cover all aspects of planning and implementing a retreat for men which focuses on spiritual renewal and bonding with other Christian men. A date has not been selected for this retreat.
- J6 **Couple's Retreat Coordination Team:** Serve as part of the team that will cover all aspects of planning and implementing a retreat for couples of all ages, focusing on spiritual renewal and relationship renewal. A date has not been selected for this retreat.

## ***WORK AREA MINISTRIES***

### ***ADMINISTRATIVE MINISTRIES***

- K1 **Calligraphy:** Use your talent to fill out baptismal certificates and other church related paperwork.
- K2 **Office Angels:** Able to work in the church office on an as-needed basis answering the phones, taking messages, making copies, etc.
- K3 **Newsletter Folding and Assembly:** Fold and assemble the newsletter once a month.
- K4 **Resource Room Steward:** Help maintain order in the resource room, organize the supplies so that they are easy for Sunday School teachers to locate, order refills of paper and other supplies when depleted.
- K5 **Membership Update:** Help research records. People are needed to call church members in the evening to get updated information about their membership records.

### ***COMMUNICATIONS MINISTRIES***

- L1 **Video Ministry:** An ever-expanding ministry! We record sermons, bible studies, and special events for viewing on the web or by DVDs. We need camera operators, producers, etc. Training is provided. Volunteers are asked to serve as needed and the length of time will vary.
- L2 **Bulletin Boards / Signage:** Organize information, and display the information in a professional manner which will welcome and encourage visitors and members to read important postings.
- L3 **Photographer for Church Events:** Attend and photograph church events so that they may be published on the website or other printed media. Pictures may also be used to document our church's history.
- L4 **Assisting with Website:** Assist in collecting and organizing information for website and/or help webmaster update website.
- L5 **Graphic Arts for Program Advertisement:** Assist program coordinators with advertisements for their events. Create posters and/or fliers for events using the computer.
- L6 **Data Projection Operators:** We need people who can operate Power Point, Easy Worship, etc. software on a computer for projection in the Sanctuary. Especially needed are people who can support this function for funerals. Volunteers are asked to serve as needed and the length of time will vary.

### ***EVANGELISM MINISTRIES***

- M1 **Be a Member of the Evangelism Committee:** If you feel called into ministry to help people, to help others find a life with Jesus Christ the Evangelism Committee is a perfect beginning. Help with planning or just offer your input and help our church outreach in the community.
- M2 **Deliver "Welcome Home" Pamphlets or Mugs to Visitors:** Have you ever felt the desire (in your faith ministry) to visit people who recently attended our church? How did you feel when you visited? Wouldn't it make someone feel wonderful to be contacted and invited back to our

church!?! This ministry delivers a church brochure or a mug to our visitors. Working on your own schedule, this ministry is simple and very rewarding!

- M3 **Telephone call (from home) to Visitors:** Each visitor who comes to our church is phoned later in the week by a member of this ministry team. A friendly “Thank you for visiting!” is all that is required.
- M4 **Church Greeter Traditional (8:30 Worship hour):** Have you ever felt the need to reach your hand out in a friendly gesture a say “Hello, glad you’re here!”? Well, you are more than qualified to be a Church Greeter. This ministry welcomes all who are attending our services.
- M5 **Church Greeter Blended (11:00 Worship hour):** Have you ever felt the need to reach your hand out in a friendly gesture a say “Hello, glad you’re here!”? Well, you are more than qualified to be a Church Greeter. This ministry welcomes all who are attending our services.
- M6 **Welcome Team Ministry:** The Welcome Team greets guests to all worship services and the FLC on Sunday mornings, providing information about LCUMC. Welcome Team ministers get to know guests and continue to greet them each week, insuring that all guests see LCUMC as a warm and friendly church, a good place to call “home.”
- M7 **Make Bread for Visitors @ Easter and Christmas:** Can you bake a small bread? You’ll be perfect for our bread ministry. This team helps in our evangelism efforts by baking breads that are handed out to visitors at our Easter & Christmas services.
- M8 **"Walkin' for Christ" Outreach Ministry:** Do you enjoy getting out on a weekend to “power walk”? While you're getting your body in shape, how about giving an invitation (to meet Jesus Christ) to people living in our new, growing communities. If you will put in 6-8 hours per year...yes, I said PER YEAR, we’d love to have your help in this ministry area. Dropping off door hangers (from our church) in the many new subdivisions would be a very rewarding commitment to our church.
- M9 **Participate in the Music Fest with Outreach in the Spring:** Help with greeting and handing out free gifts to our community friends at the LCUMC Music Fest. It’s a blast!!!

## ***FELLOWSHIP MINISTRIES***

- N1 **Orange Juice for Sunday Fellowship:** Make and clean up orange juice for fellowship time each Sunday Morning between 8am - 9:15am. Clean up at 9:45 am.
- N2 **Coffee for Sunday Fellowship:** Make and clean up coffee for fellowship time each Sunday Morning. Make coffee before 8:30am and clean up at 9:45 am.
- N3 **Pick up Donuts for Fellowship:** Pick up donuts from Ashley's Donuts before Fellowship time (9:30 AM) each Sunday for a month.
- N4 **Assist with Church-wide Picnic:** Work with others to coordinate and implement a picnic for the church family. Help is needed with advertising, securing the location, set-up and take-down of chairs and tables, arrange entertainment, purchasing paper goods and misc. items, set out and oversee the food during the picnic, etc. There is a place where everyone can assist in this once-a-year ministry!

## ***FACILITIES STEWARD MINISTRIES***

- P1 **Local Church Repair Team—Plumbing:** Provide plumbing expertise in cases when LCUMC is in need of a plumber.
- P2 **Local Church Repair Team—Electrical:** Provide licensed electrical expertise in cases when LCUMC is in need of an electrician.
- P3 **Local Church Repair Team—Carpenter:** Provide carpentry expertise in cases when LCUMC needs a carpenter.
- P4 **Local Church Repair Team—Mechanical:** Provide mechanical expertise in cases when LCUMC is in need of mechanical work.
- P5 **Local Church Repair Team—Cleaning:** Provide cleaning expertise in cases when LCUMC is in need of supplemental cleaning.
- P6 **Kitchen Angels:** Meet once/month to maintain the kitchen to health department standards. This includes cleaning refrigerator, freezer, ice machine, cabinets, shelves. Trips to Sams to purchase supplies is a shared responsibility among the kitchen angels.
- P7 **Keymasters/Building Security:** Assist with building security by unlocking and locking the church doors on Sunday mornings and patrol in the evenings during the week to assure that all the doors are secured. Volunteers serve for approx. 1.5 hours per week every six weeks.
- P8 **Bus/Van Ministry:** Drive the van from the church to events outside of city. This could also transport residents to church. Endless possibilities to serve others. Must have CDL training which is provided by one of the church's trainers.
- P9 **Shuttle Bus Driver:** Shuttle people in church bus from a satellite parking area to church on Sunday morning prior to 11:00 worship. Must have CDL training which is provided by one of the church's trainers.

## ***MEMBERSHIP CARE MINISTRIES***

- R1 **Stephen Minister:** Attend a 50-hour training at the church over the course of several months which will prepare you to serve as a Stephen Minister. Stephen Ministers are people who provide a listening ear and a caring presence for someone in need. Stephen Ministers are paired with a same-gender care-receiver and generally spend about one hour per week with their care-receiver.
- R2 **Hospital Ministry:** Visit people and their families when they are hospitalized to provide a loving touch from the church family.
- R3 **Helping Hands Ministry (Meals for Funerals):** Upon the death of a loved one, finger food will be provided for the family and out of town guests prior to or after the service if the family chooses. Each volunteer provides part of the meal.
- R4 **Calling in Love:** Assist ministerial staff by calling members to assess needs and express loving care.

- R5 **Deliver New Baby Sign:** When a new baby is born to one of our members, a "welcome baby" sign is placed in the family's yard. Volunteers will deliver the sign and pick up the sign after a specific time period.
- R6 **Visitor/New Member Folder Assistant:** Assist in preparing the folders that are taken to visitors and new members. This includes making copies, cutting pages to the correct size, putting the information in the correct order and stuffing the folders.
- R7 **Home Touch Ministry to the Homebound:** Help print and prepare for mailing weekly newsletters (that have already been written and are ready for mailing), along with a copy of the church's worship bulletin to members who are Long-term Hospitalized or Homebound.

## ***MISSIONS--COMMUNITY MINISTRIES***

- S1 **Missions Committee:** Serve on the Missions Committee and assist where needed.
- S2 **Missions Fair:** Assist in organizing and coordinating the annual missions fair at our church.
- S3 **Food Drive:** Assist in food drives sponsored by the church for Interfaith Caring Ministries and Lighthouse Christian Ministries.
- S4 **Church and Community Home Repair:** An in-house mission. Projects will be accepted from church members and community referrals.
- S5 **Blood Donor:** LCUMC has several blood drives each year. Volunteers donate blood 3-4 times each year.
- S6 **Blood Drive Worker:** Volunteers assist the blood mobile staff to ensure that the blood drives run smoothly, including coordination of sign-ups, etc.
- S7 **Interfaith Caring Ministries (ICM):** LCUMC works with ICM in a number of ways. Volunteers would choose a volunteer position open at ICM.
- S8 **Birthday Cakes for Seniors:** This is a program through ICM. Any volunteer would be asked to bake a cake once during one designated month of the year. The cake would then be delivered to a senior citizen through ICM on or near that person's birthday.
- S9 **UMCOR:** United Methodist Committee on Relief. Coordinate One Great Hour of Sharing (once a year). Act as church's contact person for UMCOR. Keep the church updated on Rita Relief.
- S10 **Lighthouse Christian Ministries:** This is a nondenominational Christian organization with resale shops in League City and Bacliff. Assistance is needed for food drives and/or clothing drives and an annual school supplies drive. Also needed is a contact person for our church.
- S11 **Wesley Community Center (Houston):** Wesley Community Center provides help for all ages to help achieve self-sufficiency, provides a safe learning environment to children, and redirects youth from juvenile delinquency to become productive adults. There are a number of volunteer opportunities on their web site: [www.wesleyhousehouston.org](http://www.wesleyhousehouston.org).
- S12 **Habitat for Humanity (Houston):** Habitat seeks to eliminate poverty housing and homelessness and to make decent shelter a matter of conscience and action.

- S13 **Early Response Team:** The mission of the Early Response Team is to provide a caring Christian presence in the aftermath of a disaster. The team is not for emergency work, recovery, rebuild, or repair. It fulfills a specific need in the early days of a disaster to establish the presence of the church. All ERTs are trained by authorized UMCOR trainers and given badges by their own conference.

## ***MISSIONS—INTERNATIONAL AND NATIONAL MINISTRIES***

- T1 **Serve on Work Team National or International:** LCUMC sends a team of volunteers on a mission to serve those in our nation and other nations who are in need, and to spread the love of Jesus Christ to those who don't know Him.
- T2 **NOMADS (National):** An outreach program of the UMC which provides persons with RVs the opportunity to share their time and skills on United Methodist projects including churches, camps, missionary agencies, and local neighborhoods.
- T3 **Heifer Project (International):** Heifer Project is an ecumenical organization that helps people in poverty become self-sufficient through the donation of various livestock. A person is needed to do a fund drive(s) throughout the year at the church.

## ***MUSIC FESTIVAL MINISTRIES***

- U1 **Music Fest Help in Whatever Ways Needed**
- U2 **Children's activities team members, (Chairperson required):** Plan, prepare, procure supplies/equipment and staff children's events, games, activities.
- U3 **Customer Service team members (Chairperson required):** Plan schedule requirements and provide for telephone and email inquiry support, coordinate with ticket sales and distribution.
- U4 **Food and Drink Vendors:** Obtain and coordinate Food and drink vendors. Provide electrical and water requirements to grounds chairperson, procure ice maker.
- U5 **Graphic Artist:** Create overall graphical presentation themes. Develop poster and T shirt graphic, Festival Logo, communicate and provide requirements to Webmaster, Advertising and Signage.
- U6 **Grounds team members, (Chairperson required):** Plan, prepare and maintain overall physical grounds and layout for the event, layout, prep/make ready. Includes but not limited to parking spaces, event areas, staging, signage, merchandise and food vendor areas, children's and youth areas, first aid area, dining, and utilities.
- U7 **Hospitality/First Aid/ Lost and Found/information team, (Chairperson required):** Plan and execute first aid needs, hospitality for entertainers and ticket holders, lost and found and information desk , provide space requirements to Grounds Chairperson.
- U8 **Master of Ceremonies:** Announce events and introduce the entertainers during the Festival.
- U9 **Merchandise:** Provide, coordinate, distribute and sell Music Festival merchandise.
- U10 **Parking team members, (Chairperson required):** Parking attendants perform various duties in conjunction with Grounds Chair. Provide parking requirements to Grounds Chairperson.

- U11 **Photographer, Videographer:** Capture events before and during the festival in picture and video.
- U12 **Press Liaison, Advertising and Promotions Assistance, Press Subject Matter Expert:** Create press releases, support advertising and promotion efforts. Provide marketing listings.
- U13 **Print Reproduction and Distribution Team, (Chairperson required):** Coordinate and enable generation of all mass-produced print projects. Work primarily with promotional event, advertising, program book and Project Manager.
- U14 **Assistant Project Manager and Productions:** Assist with initiation, planning, implementation, communication, meeting planning and documentation, close of the overall festival activities. Assist with Concert Promotions for overall marketing strategy ranging from determining event content and packaging, talent selection, with goal to raise public awareness of the festival.
- U15 **Program Book team members, (Chairperson required):** Produce a program book which contains information about the event including, but not limited to: schedules, bios of performers, event map, acknowledgements and advertisements. This position includes selling ad space to local businesses and individuals.
- U16 **Promotional events street team members, chairperson:** Plan and execute events to distribute posters and fliers to businesses, churches and individuals.
- U17 **Retail Vendors:** Coordinate retail (non food and drink) vendors, provide space and electrical requirements to Grounds Chairperson.
- U18 **Security team members, (Chairperson required):** Provide event security 24 hours per day during setup and operation of the Festival. Act as police liaison.
- U19 **Sponsorship team, (Chairperson required):** Obtain and coordinate receiving and maintaining sponsorships from local businesses and organizations. Secure logos, banners and other promotional material from sponsors within boundary of requirements for website, advertising, program book and print reproduction.
- U20 **Stage Managers:** Plan, prepare and execute delivery and timing of requirements for entertainers and bands during the Festival.
- U21 **Staging and Sound Crew, (Chairperson required):** Determine, plan, prepare and execute on-stage requirements, sound and lighting requirements, music equipment requirements and electrical requirements for the sound and equipment.
- U22 **Volunteer Recruitment and Coordination:** In coordination with each committee chair person, recruit volunteers, create and maintain spreadsheet of all volunteers.
- U23 **Web Master:** Develop website consistent with festival graphics theme. Work with Project Manager, Marketing and Promotions for requirements.
- U24 **Youth Activities team members, (Chairperson required):** Plan, prepare, procure and staff for youth events, games, activities.

## ***PRAYER MINISTRIES***

- V1 **Prayer Team:** Pray weekly for the people on the church prayer list; pray for concerns offered on prayer request cards from worship services each week; pray as needed for mid-week and emergency prayer concerns.
- V2 **Prayer Vigil Volunteer:** Participate in prayer vigil during the year by helping to coordinate before and during the vigil.
- V3 **Prayer Vigil Participant:** Pray for church leaders, congregation, ministries, and vision of LCUMC during prayer vigils.

## ***STEWARDSHIP MINISTRIES***

- W1 **Stewardship Team Member:** The Stewardship Team is searching for individuals who are excited about the future of LCUMC. Team Members will help with the development of the annual campaign by inspiring and encouraging church members to support LCUMC through their prayers, presence, gifts, and service. Our Stewardship Team goal is to help each person find their God-given talents and educate them on using those talents to support God's work.
- W2 **Stewardship Devotional Writer:** Write a devotional which may be posted on the church website which speaks of God's goodness to you through League City UMC.
- W3 **Stewardship Testimonial:** Give a short 2-minute testimonial in one of the worship services of God's goodness to you through the ministries of League City UMC.

## ***WORSHIP ARTS MINISTRIES***

- X1 **Worship Arts Choir:** Rehearse Wednesday nights from 7:30 - 9:00 pm and sing at either 8:30 am, 11:00 am, or both worship services on Sunday morning.
- X2 **Worship Arts Praise Band:** Practice Tuesday nights from 7:30 – 9:00 PM and lead worship in the 11:00 AM blended worship services.
- X3 **JuBellaté Ringers (Handbell Choir):** Rehearse Wednesday nights from 6:15 - 7:30 pm and play monthly in both services on Sunday morning. Requires some ability to read music.
- X4 **Children's Choir:** Persons needed to teach music to the children, help maintain attention, and/or keep attendance. Musical expertise is not a prerequisite – having a heart for God's children is.
- X5 **Children's Handchimes and Rainbow Bells:** Persons needed to teach music to the children, help maintain attention, and/or keep attendance. Musical expertise is not a prerequisite – having a heart for God's children is.
- X6 **Youth Music:** Volunteers needed to assist with Youth Praise Team and possibly Youth Choir.
- X7 **Instrumentalist for Worship Services:** Provide special music for Sunday morning worship services or provide music for other instrumental needs during the year. Praise Band members welcome! (Please indicate the instrument you play in the space provided on the commitment form.)
- X8 **Drama Team:** Volunteers need to create drama presentations in both worship services.

H3 **Pew Parents:** See *Family Ministries*

## **WORSHIP MINISTRIES**

- Y1 **Altar Care:** Make sure the altar is prepared properly for each worship service including caring for the paraments and polishing of the brass. Also includes care and cleaning of sacristy (the room behind the altar).
- Y2 **Communion Preparation for 8:30 Worship Hour:** Purchase elements for all services, turn in bill to financial secretary, and prepare the elements for communion.
- Y3 **Communion Preparation for 11:00 Worship Hour:** Clean up from the 8:30 worship hour, replenish the communion elements, and clean and store communion trays and linens after the service.
- Y4 **Communion Server 8:30 Worship Hour:** Serve the communion elements to the congregation during the 8:30 traditional worship service.
- Y5 **Communion Server 11:00 Worship Hour:** Serve the communion elements to the congregation during the 11:00 blended worship service.
- Y6 **Flower Ministry:** Take altar flowers to homebound members when the donor doesn't take them.
- Y7 **Lay Reader 8:30 Worship Hour:** Read scripture and lead congregation in reciting the Affirmation of Faith during the 8:30 worship service on Sunday.
- Y8 **Lay Reader 11:00 Worship Hour:** Read scripture and lead congregation in reciting the Affirmation of Faith during the 11:00 worship service on Sunday.
- Y9 **Sanctuary Steward:** Straighten sanctuary by picking up discarded bulletins and miscellaneous debris left in pews. Straighten hymnals and Bibles, replenish supply of prayer cards, offering envelopes, and registration pads.
- Y10 **Operate Sound System in one of the Worship Services:** Ensure that the sound system is adequate for all special music, praise band music and for the sermon in one of the two worship services. Includes checkout of microphones and audio system prior to service.
- Y11 **Operate Sound System for Special Events:** Ensure that the sound system is adequate for special occasions such as weddings, luncheons, and special meeting/services. Audio setup can be as simple as setting up a single speaker and microphone in FLC and as complicated as running 3 to 4 microphones along with special music for special events in the sanctuary. Frequency of service depends upon need of the audio system.
- Y12 **Usher 8:30 Worship Hour:** Welcome people, distribute bulletins and assist people with seating when needed. Maintain order and quiet in the sanctuary corridors and narthex while services are in progress. Assist latecomers with seating at appropriate times. Collect offering and assist with communion as needed. Remain alert during entire service and respond as needed.
- Y13 **Usher 11:00 Worship Hour:** Welcome people, distribute bulletins and assist people with seating when needed. Maintain order and quiet in the sanctuary corridors and narthex while

services are in progress. Assist latecomers with seating at appropriate times. Collect offering and assist with communion as needed. Remain alert during entire service and respond as needed.

- Y14 **Susanna “Sowers” Banner Makers:** Assist in making seasonal banners to be hung in the sanctuary.
- Y15 **Parking Lot Attendants:** Direct traffic on parking lot on special Sunday mornings prior to 11:00 worship (10:30 AM - 11:00 AM).
- H3 **Pew Parents:** See *Family Ministries*

## ***MISCELLANEOUS MINISTRIES***

- Z1 **Help with the Annual Garage Sale:** Help with this annual fundraiser for the church. Assist in receiving, marking, sorting donations, work during the garage sale, and final pack up and clean up. Hand out fliers from our church.
- Z2 **Table and Chair Set-up/Take-down for Special Events:** Assist in setting up tables and chairs for events requiring several tables or multiple chairs.
- Z3 **Other:** If after reading the numerous ministry descriptions, you still cannot find a place to serve, then share with us what you would like to do.
